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# Meeting Minutes – February 2007

## Old Business

Midwinters: Padre has not yet received all of the receipts, but we stand at a \$100+ gain from the event. There have been no requests for refunds, and the refund period is now closed. The event went really well. Lady Dealla says thank you to everyone for all their help. A suggestion was made with regard to the staggered feast – have some activity scheduled for after the last course is served. At this event, everything was being cleaned up and torn down right as the last course came out, and it didn't get the attention it deserved.

NotT: Everything seems to be in order. The event announcement has been submitted, and Otto has confirmed that it was fine and will appear in the March Acorn. Aryanna's last name is spelled incorrectly on the website. Kynnyth has announced the event on the kingdom rapier list, is was suggested to post to the East Kingdom as well. The staff is as follows:

Children's Activities:	Position unfilled, please volunteer. Lady Vitha has purchased cardboard castle blocks, they just need to be assembled. She will loan out the tent for the CAGE. No official activities will be scheduled, but the area will be up.

Feast Notes: Reserve early, there are only 112 spots, four of which have already been reserved. The cost is \$5.

Liquor Liscense: Lady Vitha is a notary and will bring her notarizing equipment to next month's meeting.

Lochmart Notes: Lochmart is basically an SCA yard sale. Only SCA items will be sold, such as books, garb, and fabric. You may keep whatever amount of money your items sell for, or you may donate it to the barony.

Fundraiser Notes: Lunch will be a fundraiser to help pay for the fighter practice site. It was suggested to include a bake sale, with things like cookies and brownies packaged in individual servings.

On Target: Both the primary site and the backup site have fallen through, if you have any ideas please contact Lady Caitilin before March first. The Kingdom Seneschal has looked it up – nowhere in the policy does it say we have to have a contract, but the issue is going to be brought up to Their Majesties and put into writing, so next year it may be an issue.

Baronial Birthday: The event has been Spiked for September 8<sup>th</sup>. The contract is written, and it is

currently undergoing review and approval within the school's administration. Lady Saige expects to have it in hand by the end of this week. Let it be known to all – September 8<sup>th</sup> is Sir Aelfred's birthday! The event still needs a cook. Lady Saige has not gotten ahold of Rosewitha. Duchess Simone offered to be the back-up cook. Lady Christiana will be coordinating a silent auction. If you would like to volunteer, contact Lady Saige.

Midwinters 2008: This event needs an autocrat.

### **New Business**

Mistress Kyrie requested some of our serving plates for used at the Dun Carraig event. This request was approved by those present at the meeting. The baronial cooking supplies are in need of a new home. It is temporarily being housed at Lady Dealla's.

June University will be held in Storvik on the first weekend of the month!

### **Officer Reports**

Baron and Baroness: After the difficulties we encountered with the cardboard signs at Midwinters, we are going to make real signs for the barony. We'll figure out funding detail as we go. We have decided to stay on for another year, and a vote of confidence will be conducted.

Exchequer: We took in \$1,452 and spent \$852 in the past month. Midwinters brought in \$265. The final headcount for the event was seventy two adults, one teen, three children, and three children young enough to be guests of the barony.

Chronicler: I am always accepting submissions of articles, artwork, and photographs for publication in The Dredgings. My computer has recently been rendered completely useless, resulting in not only my having to rebuild the newsletter file from scratch, but also my complete inability to print hard copies. I hope to have this situation rectified no later than the first weekend in March.

Web Minister: The website is up to date, and the flier for NotT is posted. The Dredgings were posted on time. I am waiting on Lady Christiana's Chatelaine information. The Blasted Oak and Eagle's Feather rosters have been updated, as has the Officers page. The link with directions to the library are on the site, but it was requested to make it more easily findable. Duchess Simone asked if we could link to the Kingdom OP for everyone in the barony.

Youth Minsiter: Still looking for a deputy. I have gear the gear and a tent and am willing to help coordinate, but I need someone who can keep up with everything. I should be able to resume full duties by the Baronial Birthday event.

Herald: I may not be at NotT. Lady Shannon volunteered to be a deputy, specifying that she only wishes to serve in the court herald capacity.

Chatelaine: No news, but we have one newcomer at the meeting. Welcome, Karin!

A&S: A second A&S night is now being held in conjunction with fighter practice on Tuesday nights. There is sufficient room for table-type activities.

A&S, Scriptorium and Newcomers: This month there will also be a potluck dinner gathering beginning around 5:30PM.

Brewing: Mikhail is back from his deployment, but we don't have a schedule yet.

Bellydance: Held the first and third Wednesdays of the month at Lady Caitilin's. There has been discussion about adding a daytime class, and possibly switching days.

Chirurgion: NTR

Waterbearer: I will be coordinating waterbearing activities for NotT. Volunteering is a great way to get involved and meet people! We can never have too many waterbearers, so please come by and help out. I am accepting donations to offset the cost of supplies. I need a deputy.

Heavy Marshal: We have a new fighter at practice, who has been wearing the baronial loaner gear. A second new fighter will be joining us tomorrow. Lord Aric has the waivers. He is still working on warrant issues.

Rapier Marshal: The first wave of announcements are out for NotT, and I am working on more. We have one combat archery marshal for the event, but are looking for at least one more.

Archery Marshal: Lord Aeddan is Lord Robert's deputy, and will step up when Lord Robert becomes Seneschal in May.

MoL: Rhonda wants to step down and is looking for a replacement.

\*\*\* Seneschal: As announced at Mid Winters Dance, Caitilin will step down in May. Robert will step up at that time and will likely be looking for a deputy. The clinching reason for Caitilin's leaving office after only a year is because she will be having a baby in August. That is not the only reason she is stepping down and she feels the barony deserves to understand some of the contributing factors to her decision. When she agreed to take on the position almost 4 years ago she was told that you have to run a few meetings and sign a few checks and contracts. Over the 3 years as Quhinten's deputy and this year as Seneschal she has been dealing with the significant political tension within the barony and she is burnt out. There is a whole lot of pressure on the seneschal to enforce all the new rules and regulations, which is becoming increasingly stressful. The world has changed quite a bit in the last few years and the SCA is changing too which has so far involved more stringent policies and a closer watch of officers, contracts, and finances. Your Seneschal, Exchequer and Financial Committee are not here to make your life more difficult but to try and keep the barony running within the Kingdom and Society requirements. When things run smoothly then it makes everyone's life just a little easier. She promises that they have no desire to "stir up trouble" in the barony.

If for some reason you do not like changes to existing policies or the new policies that are coming down the pipes, you are free to inform the relevant officer, but you should know that there's not a lot your local officers can do about it. From recent events, it has become increasingly obvious that Kingdom officers are more than willing to simply pull the warrants of local officers who decide to ignore policies or their kingdom officers. If you don't like something with regard to policies, write to the crowns and the kingdom officers and let them know, but keep your local officers informed of what you are doing. The more voices they hear the more likely you are to influence them. And if you really want to change things, take on a kingdom level office, get involved, become part of the problem and attempt to fix it. Your local Seneschal and officers have to enforce the rules; they do not have a choice in the matter. This issue is not unique to Lochmere, it is happening in all the baronies around us as well. We have the strength to deal with it, but we need to work together as a team.

Also, there have been people volunteering for positions that, due to life happening, they find themselves unable to fill, but they do not step forward and the responsibility has fallen to Caitilin to approach people and ask them to step down. If something happens and you cannot continue to fill your position, it is okay to step down. That is


after all what Caitilin is doing. So far everyone approached has been relieved to be asked if they want to step down but you will realize when you need out much faster than your Seneschal will. This is a volunteer organization and you have the right to un-volunteer. It greatly helps your fellow barony members who have to step in during your absence if you step down early enough before it is a real problem. That being said, when you volunteer to hold an office or autocrat an event you are taking on the responsibility of that job. Do not make the decision lightly.

Most of the barony members have been around for a while and have probably seen the growing political problems and strife within the barony. One of the things Caitilin has witnessed is that often old arguments/disagreements/problems have been significantly influencing some of the more current problems. Lingering resentments have been causing a lot of tension. It hasn't all been public, but a lot of people have seen it. Just try to remember that as time goes on people change. Our mundane jobs change, babies are born, relationships start and end, people move away or come back after a long absence. Just because someone wasn't responsible or made an offensive comment 10 years ago does not mean that they are the same person now. Let's all try to put these things behind us and not judge situations based on strife from the past and certainly not hold grudges. Be willing to give second chances and try to work as a team again. We have seen so many long standing members leave in the past year and it is terribly sad that it is unlikely that part of the barony will heal.

There is also an increasing number of newcomers (including children), which creates an interesting dynamic. We also need to try harder to be aware of newcomers and their special needs as new members of the barony and the society. Her Excellency Baroness Medb charges long-term members to remember to talk to newcomers, to welcome them to the barony and make them feel like we want them to be here with us. It is wonderful to attract newcomers but the barony will not grow without retention of new people and fresh ideas.

Caitilin isn't looking for apologies or excuses and certainly no pointing fingers, but she does encourage feedback on this matter. There is a lot of turbulence within the barony, and EVERYONE should take some time to think about if they have been a contributing factor in any of the issues of the past few years, if there is something they could change in themselves or if they have a suggestion for change in the barony. She cannot fix everything, but seeing the barony this torn apart really hurts.

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## **Night on the Town IX: Smeewick under Siege**

April 13-15th, 2007

Barony of Lochmere

The early morning mists have just begun to fade. The scout, low in the brush, gazes upon the town of Smeewick. The docks, some still blackened from the bandit raids the previous Spring, are active again. The scout watches closely as goods and merchandise are unloaded quickly from the ships to a series of warehouses. If each of those were full, there would be plenty of provisions to allow his army to push further in to Atlantia. He scans the town, trying to see what opposition they would face. There seems to be no regulars of the Atlantian army in Smeewick now, but the scout knows that the townsfolk would be quick to take up arms against any aggressor. No Atlantian town had ever been taken without a goodly amount of blood as its price. Still, the scout thought, Smeewick had the supplies the army needed. It would fall, and after that, they would be ready to strike into the heart of Atlantia. The scout crawls back down the hill, and mounts his horse. A cloud of dust erupts as he heads northward. Soon, hard eyes will watch as he proudly reports his findings. The warlord will summon his commanders and discussions will go deep into the night. While some will argue for immediately moving further into Atlantia, others point out that even with the unusually warm winter, the army is short on supplies. In the end, just as dawn is starting to show, the decision will be that Smeewick must fall first. Forces will be marshaled, blades will be made ready, and the shadow of the north will once again fall on Smeewick.

**Martial Activities:** Welcome to Atlantia's **premiere rapier event**. Rapier at Night on the Town IX will be a day of melees. You will either defend or attack the town of Smeewick and the surrounding area. All fighting will be heavy rapier, with combat archery for certain pre-set scenarios. Due to the open nature of the fighting, no combat archery will occur outside of these scenarios. Authorizations are at 9am. Target archery will also be available.

**Arts & Sciences Activities:** For those who wait in anticipation of the outcome of the enemies' attack, a great fair of artisans will be held in the village of Smeewick. Teachers in the arts will be present to show interested citizens about their craft. This is a wonderful chance to "try it before you buy it". Various arts and sciences will be available during the day to sample, including illumination techniques, book binding, netting, knitting, Viking wire knitting, beer tasting and styles, tablet weaving and so much more. Note that there is no fee associated with participation in this activity. The Wakefield Cycle (also called the Towneley Cycle) is one of four complete or nearly complete cycles of English mystery plays that still exist today. Mystery plays are short dramas that each tell one important Bible story or episode, and a full Cycle takes the audience from the Creation of the World through the birth and crucifixion of Christ to the Last Judgment. The mystery plays were vital to the Catholic Church for transmitting its values and beliefs to an audience that in most cases could not (and was not allowed to) read the Bible. They were wildly popular in period, when one to three days might be devoted to performing a Cycle.

This is my first time directing a large choir and I am very excited to have this opportunity to share my love of period choral music with so many others.

The "theme" for this year's program is "Director's Choice." In developing the program, I was focusing on several perspectives; that of the audience, the choir, and the director. First and foremost,...
