Officer Reports

B&B: Kingdom A&S was a lot of fun. Congratulations to Lord Gyles, who received his AoA. LVMG was FANTASTIC. Congratulations also to Lady Flora, Lady Isolda and Lord Gorm, all of whom have received awards in the past month, and also congratulations to Baroness Kristen for receiving her Coral Branch. If you have award recommendations, please send them to Their Excellencies. People who are deserving of awards sometimes go unnoticed. Also if you submit kingdom-level award recommendations, let Their Excellencies know as well. They have registered for a cabin at Coronation under the name Lochmere, if anyone is interested in sharing cabin space for the event. Please respond to the vote of confidence, since a lot of work and money goes into mailing it out.

Exchequer: Spent \$100 received \$107 in February. Balance is \$6881.29. Midwinters brought in \$321. Will need a new deputy when Jeremy leaves, because it is now required that Exchequers have deputies.

Chronicler: Jeremy and Lady Shannon received word today that they will be transferred to Elmendorf Air Force Base, Alaska, in July. -Bellydance: This Wednesday. Lady Caitilin is considering changing classes to the second and fourth Mondays of the month to prevent conflict with LVMG rehearsals.

Chirurgeon: Quarterly reports are due.

Waterbearer: Jeremy and Lady Shannon received word today that they will be transferred to Elmendorf Air Force Base, Alaska, in July. Lady Shannon will continue to hold her offices until the business meeting in July.

Heavy: Sir Aelfred will fill in as Knight Marshal while Aric is away. When he comes back he will take the job again.

Rapier: Lord Kynnyth is stepping up as Kingdom Deputy Marshal for Rapier. Brian will take the Baronial office. No one died at practice. Everyone will sign a waiver at practice. Brian will verify where to send them.

Archery: The archery report for the Barony of Lochmere due March tenth has been submitted. Assuming we have good weather with temperatures above fifty degrees, the Lochmere weekly archery practice will start March fifteenth at 5PM at Ivan and Alana's home on Chad Avenue. If the weather turns on us, Lord Robert will put out an email to the list on Wednesday morning for a go/no go on archery practice. Remember, there is still Sunday practice at Master Reynard's, but you must call first. There is also a Sunday practice at Baltimore Bowmen with Bright Hills. There will be target archery at NotT. Lord Robert will be going out to Camp Barrett to scout areas we can use for archery. He would prefer to use the same area we used a few years ago for coronation, but this will be up to the MiC. There has been only one application for the position of archery marsha. Lord Aeddán will assume the position in May when Lord Robert steps up as Seneschal. Lord Aeddán will be looking for a deputy. Now is a good time to check your archery gear and make sure your bow and arrows are in good shape, that you have a useable arm guard and shooting glove, and that your quiver is in good repair. The weekend that would have been On Target is Baltimore Bowmen's Traditional Classic, to be held that Friday, Saturday and Sunday. This is a good chance to shoot their range. They will have vendors and food. Lord Robery will see if we can get the weekend before the Traditional Classic for On Target next year. If we can, he'll find an autocrat.

MoL: Artur has volunteered to step up and take Lady Costanzia's place as soon as he has all the required training.

Seneschal: The quarterly report went in a day early. Everything is cool. She will start working on Robert's warrant. She got permission to start the vote of confidence early. The polling will be mailed to the members of the barony on April 9. They will need to be returned with a post-mark date no later than May 12. If you are not a member living within the zip codes of the barony, you will not receive a polling. However, you can send your opinions to Their Majesties. Please remember that a vote-of confidence is expensive for a barony and it would be horrible to waste the money and not receive responses from the populace.

Night on the Town IX: Smeewick under Siege

April 13-15th, 2007

Barony of Lochmere

The early morning mists have just begun to fade. The scout, low in the brush, gazes upon the town of Smeewick. The docks, some still blackened from the bandit raids the previous Spring, are active again. The scout watches closely as goods and merchandise are unloaded quickly from the ships to a series of warehouses. If each of those were full, there would be plenty of provisions to allow his army to push further in to Atlantia. He scans the town, trying to see what opposition they would face. There seems to be no regulars of the Atlantian army in Smeewick now, but the scout knows that the townsfolk would be quick to take up arms against any aggressor. No Atlantian town had ever been taken without a goodly amount of blood as its price. Still, the scout thought, Smeewick had the supplies the army needed. It would fall, and after that, they would be ready to strike into the heart of Atlantia. The scout crawls back down the hill, and mounts his horse. A cloud of dust erupts as he heads northward. Soon, hard eyes will watch as he proudly reports his findings. The warlord will summon his commanders and discussions will go deep into the night. While some will argue for immediately moving further into Atlantia, others point out that even with the unusually warm winter, the army is short on supplies. In the end, just as dawn is starting to show, the decision will be that Smeewick must fall first. Forces will be marshaled, blades will be made ready, and the shadow of the north will once again fall on Smeewick.

Martial Activities: Welcome to Atlantia's **premiere rapier event**. Rapier at Night on the Town IX will be a day of melees. You will either defend or attack the town of Smeewick and the surrounding area. All fighting will be heavy rapier, with combat archery for certain pre-set scenarios. Due to the open nature of the fighting, no combat archery will occur outside of these scenarios. Authorizations are at 9am. Target archery will also be available.

Arts & Sciences Activities: For those who wait in anticipation of the outcome of the enemies' attack, a great fair of artisans will be held in the village of Smeewick. Teachers in the arts will be present to show interested citizens about their craft. This is a wonderful chance to "try it before you buy it". Various arts and sciences will be available during the day to sample, including illumination techniques, book binding, netting, knitting, Viking wire knitting, beer tasting and styles, tablet weaving and so much more. The Known World Players are preparing to perform 10 plays from the Wakefield Cycle at Pennsic 36 (2007), and are looking for groups to sponsor and perform the various plays. The Wakefield Cycle (also called the Towneley Cycle) is one of four complete or nearly complete cycles of English mystery plays that still exist today. Mystery plays are short dramas that each tell one important Bible story or episode, and a full Cycle takes the audience from the Creation of the World through the birth and crucifixion of Christ to the Last Judgment. The mystery plays were vital to the Catholic Church for transmitting its values and beliefs to an audience that in most cases could not (and was not allowed to) read the Bible. They were wildly popular in period, when one to three days might be devoted to performing a Cycle.

This is my first time directing a large choir and I am very excited to have this opportunity to share my love of period choral music with so many others.

The "theme" for this year's program is "Director's Choice." In developing the program, I was focusing on several perspectives; that of the audience, the choir, and the director. First and foremost,... We need voices in all the sections (SSAATB). However, if past years are any indication, we will be in particular need of baritones, basses, and tenors.
