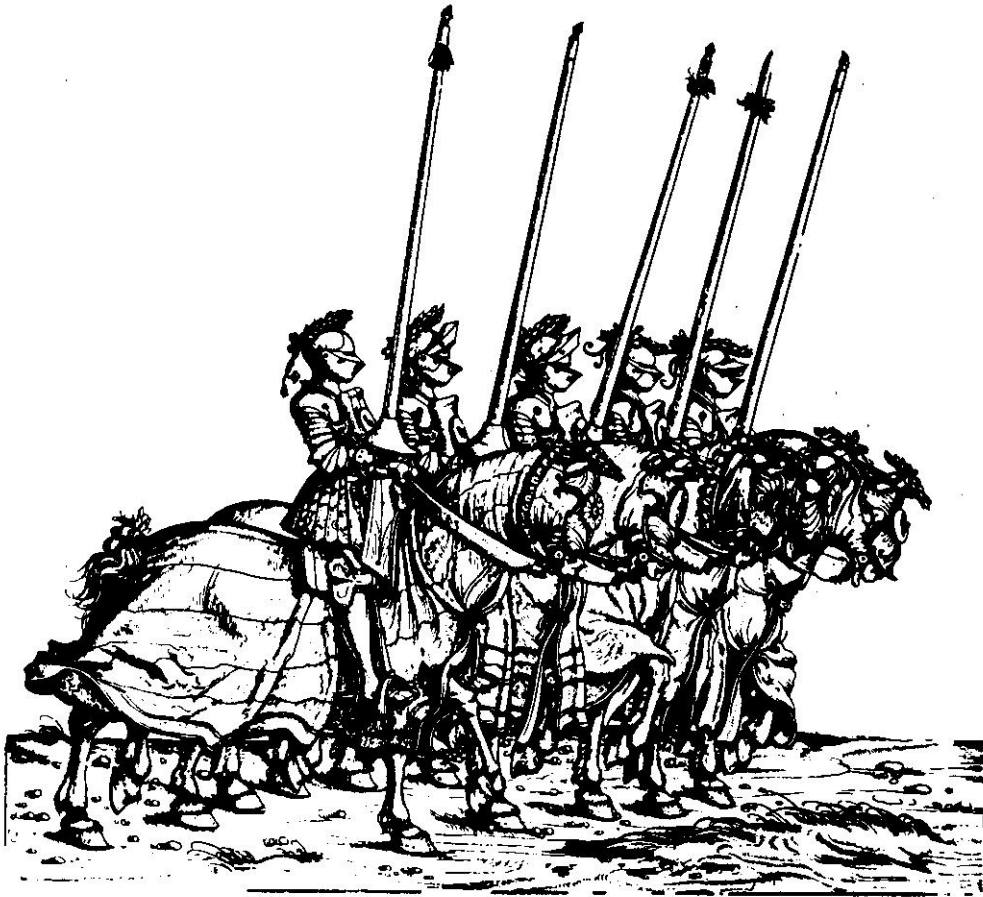

September Business Meeting, 8 September 2008

Old Business

Baronial Birthday: Currently we have (as of Sunday) 51 off-board and many on-board reservations. Baron 'Evil Bob' is our parking guru. Arrangements have been made with Reynard, Arianna, & Vlad for the list-field, Baronial Pavilion, day-shade, etc., to be picked up/delivered. List-field plans are being made.

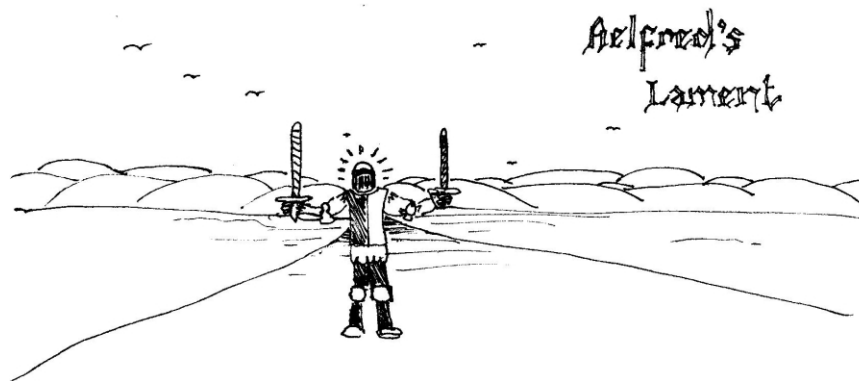
Baroness Storvik has volunteered to help set-up and such. Liquor license to be taken care of. Troll is covered. Feast servers are covered. The final schedule has been tentatively made tentative. Music is taken care of for processing in/out. A further request for feast entertainment will be made. Cleanup is taken care of. The 'original' thrones may be available (at least partly) for display. Other miscellaneous equipment is being gathered. A site visit is being planned, timing will be posted to the list. Signage will be arranged (new entrance route to avoid Pirate Weekend at the MDRF).

Midwinter's: The contract has been signed and sent (with the checks for deposit/site rental). The 'Guild Heads' have been contacted, and so far that is proceeding apace. The budget has been approved by the Budgetary Committee.

On Target 2009: Is a 'GO'. Probably 30 May. Reynard will be Autocrat. This will be the last year for a while in which we can hold this event on the last weekend of May. Contract nearly ready to go, liquor license will be dealt with.

NOTT 2009: Normal weekend for NOTT will be Easter, so to when shall we move it? Last weekend in April (25th)? (Overall approval for last weekend in April). Camp Barrett is a possibility, with Croom Lake site (borrowed from Storvik) as a backup.

Storage Shed: Tabled pending further research.

The originals will still be maintained by the Chronicler.

Youth Minister: CC will cover for January; there have been no other (more permanent) volunteers as yet. A copy of the changes to Atlantian Law relative to this position have been provided her.

A&S: Everything is under control for A&S at the Baronial Birthday. A&S this month is for the 15th; Simone & Alfred's place is not available, volunteers for another location will be accepted.

Heavy Marshal: We are practicing inside; good turnout since Pennsic. 2 new people.

Rapier Marshal: We are inside as well, see Heavy Marshal's report. 3-4 new people.

Archery: We are outside; attendance has been a bit low. Practice is Thursdays at Aeddán Ivor's, other days are available with advance arrangement through Aeddán.

Music: Still practice on Wednesdays, although location will probably change from Vitha's at the end of the month. Male voices will be gladly accepted.

Seneschal: 'They' have updated the SPIKE event registration system. Complaints have been made as to availability of classes required for various warranted positions (eg: only Exchequer 101 available at University). University schedule may have updates to accommodate this. Unevent will be in Richmond. Bids for Atlantian 30th Year (2011) will be accepted shortly... Next meeting on 6 October at the Library (also the reservation day for all events the following year).

Directions:

From the West (in MD): Take the best route to Route 32 East to I-97 South. From I-97 take Exit 5, Route 178/Crownsville. At the light off Route 32, Route 178 goes straight and also goes to the left. Continue straight on Route 178 South for approx 1.8 miles. At the light, turn right onto Crownsville Rd. Continue for approx 1 mile and turn right onto Hawkins Rd (there is a sign for Elks Camp Barrett). Continue for approx 1.8 miles. At the bottom of the hill, go thru the stop sign to enter the Camp.

From the North: Take best route to I-97 South to Exit 5 and follow directions above for those coming from the West.

From the South: From the Capital Beltway (I-495), take Exit 19A Route 50 East to Exit 23 Route 450/Parole. Take Route 450 West and turn left at the light in front of Annapolis Mall (this is still Rt. 450). Continue approx 2 miles. Turn right at the light onto Crownsville Rd. After 0.5 mile there will be a blue sign for Elks Camp Barrett. Take a left onto Chesterfield Rd and go approx 1.4 miles. The site is on your left.
