Old Business:

Bardic Circle: Corun's House Dec 8th. Please bring food to share.

Midwinter's: Need volunteers for troll, set up Friday and Saturday and break down Sigrid will be posting for assistance with serving. Auction will take place- an audible auction will occur prior to the play. King and Queen coming. Please consider donating to a largesse basket. CC and Simone will take care of food for privy chamber. Arianna has musicians scheduled during the day. Simone handling retainers for TRM. Newcomers table will be set up. Rehearsal's going well and we are having lots of fun.

Night out of Town: Camp Barrett does not have us set up yet. Arianna will call the Board of Directors . Symone de la Rochelle will be the Marshal in charge. Planning overnight activities such as a torchlight pas and a large bonfire. We will have breakfast served Sunday morning.

On Target: Susan McKinney (Signy?) – Dealla will be mentoring.

Battle of the Bay: Medb – updates should show up online soon.

Policies ideas: we will not vote on this tonight- will be sent to the e-list give it some thought. Will vote on this in January. If you are unable to attend please email their Excellencies or the seneschal with your ideas and concerns. A copy will be sent to the Kingdom seneschal. Does this reflect what we really want to do?

Last month we passed a motion that new Lochmere autocrats will be assisted by a mentor. We will be writing up a policy as there will be new requirements for autocrats coming down from Kingdom.

Santiago has established an email list for officers.

New Business:

Our next event to talk about will be Midwinter's 2014. If you are interested in autocratting let the seneschal know.

Officer's reports:

B&B: Our next event will be 12th night and then Midwinter's, Their Majesties will have curia at Ymir. A town hall was held at Unevent. Potential law changes were discussed.

Seneschal: Polling of Confidence will take place in February. Their Majesties have asked Their Highnesses to make decision as they will be on the throne. Next Curia at Ymir. The definition of Kingdom events has changed-there are no longer official and unofficial events. Now has changed to Kingdom Calendar events and local events. Traditional events, demos, A&S and fighter practices (even a barbeque) - must collect waivers at advertised activities. Alric will collect waivers for practices. No more placeholders on kingdom calendars for events- must have site information. If your site changes it goes to the bottom of the list for the 150 mile rule. For autocrats when local authorities (ambulances, etc.) are called to an event the kingdom seneschal must be notified immediately. Find the local seneschal to have them report it. Autocrats must be 'deputized and warranted' seneschals will establish and maintain complete event files. Seneschal will keep even copies of gate files. Regional seneschal- event planning meetings will be held again via conference call. Autocrats must get written permission to use personal information for event announcements. Kingdom Seneschal - encouraged to hold less events and groups are encouraged to hold 'day in the park' events. Seneschals will be required to get background checks. No one is to give any interviews to the media without contacting the Kingdom seneschal. Please contact the seneschal for clarifications on changes.

Chatelaine – at unevent there were some changes to chatelaine policy. They will offer the classes online and through conference calls. Demo request to Sheep and Wool festival. Still waiting to hear. The Alpaca farm in Frederick Co- Bright Hills is interested in putting together at demo. Avice will be at Newcomers night in December. If you know anyone who hasn't played in awhile invite them back. How do we retain members? I want to set up a mentor program and get long term members to help interact with newcomers- this is productive for both.

Chronicler- attended unevent. Some revisions in office, newsletters will be sent out earlier in the month. A very productive meeting.

Exchequer \$12001.30 my warrant got signed. Pending deposit of \$65. Need to write some checks. Spent 2 hours in exchequer meeting . Usual reminders of how to do things. If you are having prizes – no gift cards or prepaid gift items. There are changes coming to Kingdom financial policy. Gabe (MOL) will be the $3^{\rm rd}$ member of our financial committee. Kingdom has \$39000 in their coffers.

Discussion at unevent meeting about consideration to make MOAS a required office . Discussion about how the SCA is an educational organization and proving it with A&S activities in order to maintain our status with the IRS. CC- discussion at Herald's meeting about documenting activities for our nonprofit status.

Seneschal brought up that Polling costs will be next month- each package gets 2 envelopes and 2 stamps. Estimate of \$250. **Vote to cover up to \$400 for polling cost - VOTE PASSED Unanimously.**

Webminister: 215 visits to website. Updated Avice's op entry. Added other items-Added Avice as deputy chatelaine. Social media – facebook page has more likes Social media is now an initiative at the Kingdom media. Kingdom policy will require all deputies to be warranted. I need deputies to do some maintenance.

The webminister's wife wants him to have a deputy. We have lots of social media that needs to be looked at. If you want to contribute contact me.

Knight marshal: I need waivers by the 10th of the month following the quarter.

Archery Marshal – kingdom archer marshal has written a new handbook. It is available on the kingdom website. We get to have waivers at archery practice. Marshals will be getting warrant cards just like the fighter's cards.

Chirurgeon- not present sent report- nothing to report attended unevent.

Chamberlain – nothing to report

A&S – not present sent report. Next combo is Dec 11th and will include dancing. New combo nights will be listed in January on website. Midwinter's – lots of A&S activities.

Herald- not present sent report- CC attended Herald's meeting at unevent - looking for new heralds-book, field.

MOL – nothing to report- no events.





Poetry Corner

TIME AND THE YEAR

by THOMAS TUSSER

Of God, to thy doings, a time there is sent, Which endeth with time that in doing is spent;
For time is itself, but a time for a time.
Forgotten full soon, as the time of a chime.

In Spring-time we rear, we do sow, and we plant:
In Summer get victuals, lest after we want;
In Harvest we carry in corn, and the fruit,
In Winter to spend, as we need of each suit.

The year I compare, as I find for a truth, The Spring unto Childhood, the Summer to Youth, The Harvest to Manhood, the Winter to Age, All quickly forgot, as a play on a stage.

Time past is forgotten, ere men be aware; Time present is thought on, with wonderful care;

Time coming is feared, and therefore we save, Yet oft ere it come we be gone to the grave.

The lands and the riches that here we possess

Be none of our own, if a God we profess;

But lent us of Him, as His talent of gold.

Which being demanded, who can it withhold?

God maketh no writing, that justly doth say, How long we shall have it, — a year or a day; But leave it we must (howsoever we leave). When Atrop shall pluck us from hence by the sleeve.

To Death we must stoop, be we high, be we low, But how, and how suddenly, few be that know; What carry we then but a sheet to the grave To cover this carcass, of all that we have?

Thomas Tusser, "The British Varro," and one of the earliest English didactic poets. Born in Essex about 1520, he went to school at Eton, where he was under the severe rule of Udall, the author our first comedy. Tusser soon abandoned literature for farming. His one production of note, which Southey thought deserving of republication, is a practical, homely attempt to teach agriculture in verse; valuable for the light it throws on the English farming methods of his day rather than as a poem. This once popular "old English Georgic" (Warton) is entitled in its first edition (published the same year as Tottel's collection). One Hundred Points of Good Husbandry. It was subsequently enlarged to Five Hundred Points... "His plough and his poetry were alike unprofitable," and accordingly he died in poverty in London, A.D. 1580. Tusser's work went through a great many editions, and was parodied in A Hundred Points of Evil Huswifry in 1565.


