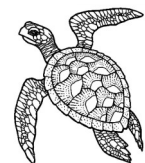
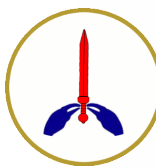
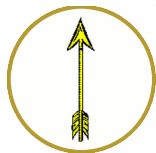

14 CE: Roman gastronome Marcus Gavius Apicius, creator of Culinary Matters (De Re Coquinaria or De Re Culinaria) the world's first known book of recipes.

Within the book is a recipe to make a "Sauce for all kinds of game, boiled or roast (ius in venationibus omnibus elixis et assis): eight scruples of pepper, rue, lovage, celery seed, juniper, thyme, dry mint: six scruples in weight [each], three scruples of flea-bane; reduce all this to the finest powder, put it together in a vessel with sufficient honey and use it with vinegar and garum."



Lovage is a tall perennial plant, resembling wild celery, but is more pungent with musky overtones. It was used similar to celery but it has a much milder and sweeter taste. It is distinctly warm and has a spicy fragrance.² The parts that can be used include the leaves, stalks, roots, and seeds.³ It was popular as a flavoring herb in classical Greek and Roman times and continued to be a medicinal herb

found in most medieval gardens. The leaves were also used to flavor cordials while the stalks were cooked like celery.²



Flea-bane is an herb derived from a perennial plant native to most parts of Europe. It has a soft, hoary foliage with flat heads of one, two, or three bright yellow flowers about an inch across. Flea-bane is an astringent with a slightly soapy smell and an extremely bitter taste. Its young leaves were used in Roman summer salads. Modern cooks often substitute it with rosemary when trying to reproduce ancient recipes.

Officer Spotlight – Herald



The Herald organizes our heraldry, both visual symbols and public announcements. Many of their duties are similar to their medieval counterparts. At events they are the voice of the Crown, the organizer or coronet, make announcements, and conduct court.

Heraldry helps us know who we are looking at and who we are talking about. In a battle it is hard to distinguish one suit of armor from another so this is where heraldry (device, arms, etc.) steps in to help distinguish people or groups from one another.

Heraldry also helps us make sure our device is not too similar to someone else's. They can help us choose a proper name that goes together with the right time period.

John Donne-1572-1631

Donne was born in London between 24 January and 19 June 1572 into the precarious world of English recusant Catholicism, whose perils his family well knew. His father, John Donne, was an ironmonger. His mother, Elizabeth (Heywood) Donne, a life-long Catholic, was the greatniece of the martyred Sir Thomas More. His uncle Jasper Heywood headed an underground Jesuit mission in England from 1581 to 1583 and, when he was caught, was imprisoned and then exiled; Donne's younger brother, Henry, died from the plague in 1593 while being held in Newgate Prison for harboring a seminary priest. Yet at some time in his young manhood Donne himself converted to Anglicanism and never went back on that reasoned decision... John Donne's standing as a

great English poet, and one of the greatest writers of English prose, is now assured. However, it has been confirmed only in the present century. The history of Donne's reputation is the most remarkable of any major writer in English; no other body of great poetry has fallen so far from favor for so long and been generally condemned as inept and crude. In Donne's own day his poetry was highly prized among the small circle of his admirers, who read it as it was circulated in manuscript, and in his later years he gained wide fame as a preacher... Donne's love poetry was written nearly four hundred years ago; yet one reason for its appeal is that it speaks to us as directly and urgently as if we overhear a present confidence."
