Bitter Oranges

1332: the trade of bitter oranges begins in Nice. To this point no other kind of Orange (a word derived from Hindi) is known in Europe, although Seville oranges were introduced by Arabs into the Mediterranean region during the 9th or 10th century.¹

How to bake Orenge²

Faire peelee your Orenge, and pick away all the white that is under the peelee, and so lay them in fine paste, and put into them Sugar, very little Sinamon or none at all, but a little Ginger and bake them very leisurely.

To make Conserve of Orenge²

Take Orenge and pare them very thin the red of the out sides away and quarter them in four, and take away the white of the inside, then seeth them in faire water softlye for breaking, ofte change them in warm water til they be lost: as the yelownes dooth seeth away, so weareth away the bitternes, then take them out of the water and lay them in a fair vessell that the water may run away from them, then beate them small with a spoone, and put to every pound of Orenge one pound of sugar, and half a pound of Rosewater, and boile them together and box them.

To preserve Orenge²

Take your Pilles and water them two nights and one day and dry them clean againe, and boyle them with a soft fire the space of one hower, then take them out to coole, and make your sirrop half with rosewater and half with that liquor & put double sugar to your Orenge, and when your sirup is halfe sodden, then let your Orenge seethe one quarter of an houre more, then take out your Orenge & let the sirup seeth untill it rope, and when all is colde, then put your Orenge into the sirrop: the white of an Egge and Sugar beaten together, will make it to candie.

Dante Alighieri 1265-1321

Dante is regarded as one of the finest Italian poets and is considered a major influence in Western culture. He is most famous for his epic poem *Commedia* (The Divine Comedy). Dante was born in Florence in 1265 and during his teens had an apprenticeship with Brunetto Latino, a celebrated poet of the time. Dante inherited a small fortune in 1283 and enrolled at the university of Bologna at age 21 but left school within two years to join the Florentine army and participate in the Battle of Campaldino. In 1290 His romantic ideal, Beatrice Portinari died, inspiring him to write lyrical poems like *Vita Nuova*. He also became involved in Florentine politics, which eventually led to his life-time banishment from the city. Dante is buried in Ravenna where he spent many years of his exile.

To the dim light and the large circle of shade
I have clomb, and to the whitening of the hills,
There where we see no color in the grass.
Natheless my longing loses not its green,
It has so taken root in the hard stone
Which talks and hears as though it were a lady.

Utterly frozen is this youthful lady,
Even as the snow that lies within the shade;
