#### **Baron and Baroness:**


- Did a fighter practice poll to see who is available

The menu was as follows: First Remove: Various cheeses Bread Herbed Butter Salad with vinaigrette

Second Remove: Sausage with sauce Mushrooms with leeks Boiled Peas

Third Remove: Cheese Fritters

Cheese:

Buy some fancy cheese! Cut into bite sized pieces and plate.

#### Bread:

Herbed Butter: Ingredients: 1 stick of butter, at room temperature 1 clove garlic, minced 1 teaspoon (tsp.) honey

#### Method:

Place butter into a bowl and add garlic and honey

Mix until well combined.

If you want to be fancy you can press into a mold and place in the refrigerator to harden.

When ready to serve, remove from the mold and place alongside your bread.

Salad with vinaigrette: This recipe is adapted from The Forme of

### Cury, c. 1390 CE, England [1]

#### Ingredients:

1 head of leafy lettuce (NOT ICEBERG) Handful flat leaf parsley, de-stemmed and chopped (not the curly kind)

1 small leek, thinly sliced (include green and white) - make sure you clean it well!

3 scallions, thinly sliced (include green and white)

- 3 tablespoons (Tbls.) olive oil
- 1 Tbls. white wine vinegar
- 1 garlic clove, minced
- 1 tsp. fresh sage, de-stemmed and minced
- 1 tsp. fresh mint, minced

#### Method:

Toss lettuce, parsley, leeks, and scallions. Put olive oil, garlic, sage, and mint into a container you can shake thoroughly. Pour over your salad and toss.

Sausage with sauce: This recipe is from 'Sauces from Poitou', found at Durham Cathedral, England, c. 1170 CE [2]

Ingredients:

4 pork sausages, or any type that you prefer - doesn't have to be pork or meat 4 cloves garlic, peeled and thinly sliced

- 150 ml ( $\tilde{2}/3$  cup) cider vinegar or verjus 1 handful sage, leave whole to blanch
- first, then de-stemmed and finely chopped 2 handfuls of flat leaf parsley, de-

stemmed and finely chopped

1 tsp. finely ground black pepper Sea salt (any salt is fine, I prefer Kosher salt) and freshly-ground black pepper to taste

Honey to taste

Method:

Cook your sausages as preferred until cooked through, put to the side and cover to keep them warm.

Put on a pan of water to boil.

In another saucepan, over medium heat, pour in the vinegar and add the garlic. Cook, stirring occasionally, until it is reduced by half. Allow to cool.

Take a bowl, big enough to place your sage in, and add some water and ice (making an ice bath). Blanch sage in your first pan of boiling water and immediately place in iced water. Remove sage from the stems and finely chop. Add to the garlic and vinegar mixture. Take a stick blender and blend to a smooth consistency. If you don't have a stick blender you can do this with a blender as well.

Add parsley, pepper, salt, and honey to taste.

Serve with your cooked sausages.

Mushrooms and Leeks: This recipe is from The Forme of Cury, c. 1390 CE, England [1]







Ingredients: 8-oz of mushrooms, diced

1 leek, chopped, include white and green - make sure you clean it well!

1 Tbls. olive oil

 $\frac{1}{4}$  cup of chicken stock (or stock of your choice) Salt to taste

Pinch of saffron

1 teaspoon poudre forte[3]

Add oil to a sauce pan on medium high heat. Add mushrooms and leeks and saute until the mushrooms are wilty and leeks have browned up a bit.

Add chicken stock and saffron.

Continue to cook, stirring to combine everything.

Give it a taste and add salt if needed.

Remove to a serving dish and sprinkle with poudre forte over the top and serve.

#### Boiled Peas:

This recipe is adapted from A Book of Cookrye, originally published in 1584, England [4]

Boiled Peas

<sup>1</sup>/<sub>2</sub> pound of peas (fresh or frozen)

 $\frac{1}{2}$  cup of whole milk

1 egg yolk, whisked

<sup>1</sup>/<sub>4</sub> cup breadcrumbs <sup>1</sup>/<sub>2</sub> tsp. fresh ginger, minced

Saffron, pinch

 $\frac{1}{2}$  teaspoon of salt

2 Tbls. flat leaf parsley, de-stemmed and chopped

#### Method:

Place a large pot on medium heat and bring milk to a low boil, stirring, careful not to scald milk.

Once you have a low boil slowly whisk in egg yolk.

Mix in peas, bread crumbs, ginger, and saffron, stirring to combine. Once peas are cooked through, place in a serving dish and sprinkle with chopped parsley and salt.

#### Cheese Fritters:

This recipe is adapted from The Book of Sent Sovi: Medieval recipes from Catalonia, c. mid-fourteenth century, Spain [5]

Ingredients:

1 cup all-purpose flour

1 ½ tsp. baking powder

 $\frac{1}{2}$  tsp. salt

2 eggs, well beaten

<sup>1</sup>/<sub>2</sub> cup milk

<sup>1</sup>/<sub>2</sub> cup shredded cheese of choice (I used homemade manchego)

Oil for frying (peanut or canola are good for high heat frying)

Poudre Douce[6]

Method:

Sift together flour, baking powder, and salt into a large mixing bowl.

In a separate bowl mix eggs and milk.

Add egg mixture to the flour mixture and mix with a whisk until smooth and well blended.

Fold in shredded cheese with a wooden spoon.

Heat oil in a dutch oven, over medium high heat until you reach 325°. If you have a deep fryer, even better!

Drop by tablespoons and fry until golden brown. Fry in batches and place on a paper towel to soak up excess grease. Sprinkle with poudre douce. Plate and serve.

#### 1. The Forme of Cury, c. 1390 CE

2. This recipe comes from the earliest known culinary collection in medieval Europe, from Durham Cathedral priory in the North East of England, which advertise themselves as Sauces from Poitou. They date to c. 1170. The recipes were developed by the Eat Medieval Team – Professor Giles Gasper (Durham), Andy Hook (owner of Blackfriars), and Head Chef Chris Wardale. Our aim is to interpret the medieval recipes, all faithfully transcribed (and elsewhere analyzed by Professor Gasper and Professor Faith Wallis), for the modern restaurant, using the knowledge, experience, and skill of the chefs at Blackfriars to bring the past to life. All recipes are copyright to Durham University and Blackfriars Restaurant.

Recipe is based off of The Forme of Cury c. 1390 CE 1 tsp. ground black pepper

1 tsp. ground cinnamon

- 1 tsp. ground mace
- 1 tsp. ground ginger
- 1 tsp. ground cloves

1 tsp. long pepper or grains of paradise, both ground with mortar and pestle

Combine all ingredients and store in an airtight container.

1 teaspoon ground ginger

1 teaspoon grains of paradise, ground with mortar and pestle

Pinch of ground nutmeg

Pinch of ground galangal

1 cup sugar

Combine all ingredients and store in an airtight container. This is fantastic to use with French Toast!

#### Laydes Fayre: A Peek Behind the Scenes Part Two

In last month's installment, I stated that a lot must happen before Laydes Fayre performs and even before we start a rehearsal season. In addition to mapping out the rehearsal and performance schedule at least 6 months in advance, I must select appropriate music. What constitutes "appropriate music?" When selecting music, I consider the following questions: Is it within the SCA's period of study? Will the audience enjoy it? Will the Laydes be able to sing it? Will I enjoy teaching and directing it?

The first question is easy to address. The official SCA charter states that "The Society for Creative Anachronism (SCA) is an inclusive community pursuing research and re-creation of pre-seventeenth century skills, arts..." Some SCA chapters and kingdoms stretch the time period to 1650.

Musically speaking, the Baroque period is generally recognized as starting around 1650 with some foreshadowing of style changes in the late 16th century. Therefore, my rule of thumb is to look for music that was written by a composer born before 1600.

The second question, "Will the audience like it?" is a little more challenging. I generally try to keep the program up-beat. We sing anywhere from 3 to 8 pieces at an event and 15 – 20 pieces in a stand-alone concert. Approximately 80% of each performance is comprised of pieces with moderate to faster tempos and lighter subject matter. The other 20% is comprised of slower songs with of a more serious nature. I also select pieces from a variety of genres and languages. Although most of our music tends to be from the 16th century, I do try to include pieces from the 13th, 14th, and 15th centuries when possible.

The third question is the most challenging to address. As I said in last month's installment, no auditions are required nor is the ability to read music. As a result, the members have different levels of singing and music reading experience. Some members are beginners. Others are serious amateurs or semi-professionals. One member is a professional musician/music teacher. To complicate matters, there are some members that have no experience with foreign languages. I consider everyone's experience level when selecting music. Those who are more experienced need to be challenged. Those with less experience also need to be challenged, but not to the point of frustration. Continued on page 9

Therefore, most of the pieces I select could be considered as being of moderate difficulty. I also select one or two easy pieces and one or two more difficult pieces. That way, the more experienced singers are not bored and those with less experience grow musically and vocally without wanting to give up. Additionally, the vocal ranges of each singer in the group must be considered. We have first sopranos, second sopranos, first altos, second altos and tenors. I know everyone's range and trouble spots and can work with all of them.

Arrangements for mixed voices (Soprano, Alto, Tenor, and Bass) are more readily available. However, arrangements for women's voices are not impossible to find. Choral Wiki (cpdl.org) and IMSLP.org have quite a few available free of charge in the Public Domain. Arrangements can also be purchased from a variety of publishing companies. Sometimes an arrangement does not exist for the

appropriate voice parts. In that case, I will arrange it so the Laydes can sing it. Sometimes my muse inspires me to write a new piece of music for the Laydes, but that is another matter entirely.

The last question "Will I enjoy teaching and directing it?", is important and straight-forward. The answer must be yes. I do not expect my group to enjoy singing a piece of music that I do not enjoy. It would have a negative impact on our ability to enjoy rehearsing as well as our ability to perform it well.
