- ◆ Let me know if I have forgotten anything





Food For Thought

On May 1, about halfway between the spring equinox and summer solstice, was a time for the celebration of life and love, procreation and renewal known as May Day throughout Europe or Beltane, translated as 'lucky fire,' traditionally celebrated in Ireland, Scotland, and the Isle of Man. In the Germanic areas they celebrated Walpurgis Night.

Its roots can be found with the Floralia, the festival of Flora, the Roman goddess of flowers, from April 27 – May 3, and the Maiouma or Maïuma, a festival celebrating Dionysus and Aphrodite held every three years during the month of May.

The beginning of summer was a time plants were in full bloom. To celebrate people would have fun playing games and singing songs celebrating the world of greenery and new life around them. At the end of the night they would have a fabulous feast featuring green food.

A special oatcake or bannock made from eggs, milk, and oatmeal was eaten by all and offered to the animals and plants in return for the promise of a full harvest. Beltaine embodied the fresh tastes from nature's rekindled generosity.

Here are some "green" recipes to help you celebrate May Day properly:

PERREY OF PESOUN [Pulp of peas]

Take pesoun and seep hem fast and covere hem til þei berst. þenne take up hem and cole hem thurgh a cloth. take oynouns and mynce hem and seep hem in the same sewe and oile perwith, cast þerto suger, salt and saffroun, and seep hem wel þeratt þerafter and serue hem forth.

FOR TO MAKE GRONDEN BENES [For to make ground beans]

Take benes [fava beans] and dry hem in a nost or in an Ovene and hulle hem wele and wyndewe out þe hulk and wayshe hem clene an do hem to seep in gode broth an ete hem with Bacon.

CABOCHES IN POTAGE [Cabbage in potage]

Take Caboches and quarter hem and seeth hem in gode broth with Oynouns y mynced and the whyte of Lekes y slyt and corue smale and do þer to saffroun an salt and force it with powdour douce.

HEBOLACE

Take Oynouns and erbes and hewe hem small and do þes to gode broth. and aray it as þou didest caboches. If þey be in fyssh day, make on the same maner with water and oyle. and if it be not in Lent alye it with zolkes of Eyren. and dresse it forth and cast þer to powdour douce.

ERBOLATES

Take parsley, mint, savory, sage, tansey, vervain, clary, rue, ditayn (?), fennel, southernwood. Hew them & grinde them small, mix them up with eggs. Butter a cloth & do þe forcemeat thereto & bake it & present it forth.

JUSSELL

Take bread grated and eyggs and swyng it togydre. Do thereto saffroun, sawge, and salt, & cast broth thereto, boile it & present it forth.





Composer's CORNER

Laydes Fayre: A Peek Behind the Scenes Part One



Recently, several people have encouraged me to write an article about the group. Therefore, I decided that it was time to take a break from Composers' Corner and write the story that I have been encouraged to tell. My love for collaborative music started at an early age when my 4th grade music teacher asked me to join the choir. I soon discovered that singing with a group of other kids was much more fun than singing alone! Singing is an art, and singing in a choir is an art and a team sport. Members of a choir must work together to achieve the desired result: music that sounds good, is fun to sing, and entertains the audience.

Although I love mixed voices choirs (male and female voices) it's always a challenge to find men who are willing to sing in a choir. So in 1999, I decided to establish a new vocal music

ensemble for female voices within the context of the SCA. Laydes Fayre will be celebrating its 22nd anniversary this fall.

None of the members of Laydes Fayre have had to endure an audition. Auditions are not required nor is the ability to read music. The only necessary qualifications are the ability to sing in tune, attend rehearsals, have a good sense of humor, and leave egos at the door.

We rehearse two Fridays each month for about 90 minutes. That's not a lot of rehearsal time. In spite of the limited rehearsal time, we manage to learn anywhere from 10 – 20 pieces a year, most of which are 3 or 4-part pieces. Over the last 22 years we have learned approximately 300 pieces of music from the 13th – 16th century in multiple languages including Latin, Italian, French, German, Spanish, Hebrew, Flemish, English and Middle English. We perform roughly 5 times a year, sometimes more depending on the events and members' availability. We occasionally perform in non-SCA venues and have recorded two CDs: "Here's to the Laydes" and "Fayre Play".

Laydes Fayre is an inter-baronial group based in the Barony of Lochmere.


The siege of Acre took place on May 18, 1291 and ended in the Crusaders losing control of Acre to the Mamluks.


