# Food For Thought

## Rue (Ruta graveolens)

Date 1497 and 1500

Shrubby with blue-green and fleshy leaves identified as bitter in taste and unappealing smell. This herb can be used dried or fresh, similar to basil or thyme, in meats and some alcoholic drinks. Is more widely known for its medicinal properties and sometimes referred to as "herb of grace" because of its used to sprinkle holy water during Catholic Mass ceremonies. (Davidson, 2014). In Shakespeare's play, Hamlet, rue was offered by Ophelia to Queen Gertrude as a token of repentance, while Ophelia saves some for herself in regret, however again references it as the herb of grace. It's use in alcohol was largely seen as pharmaceutical as seen in the recipe for Aqua Vite,

"Elixir of Life", as one of the herbs mixed with wine, heated, and distilled. Rue is also listed as an ingredient for a poultice, with salt and onion, to treat a dog bite. (Scully, 2005)

Rue was one of the basic ingredients, specifically aromatic herbs, for sauces used in Roman cooking, along with lovage, cardamom, cumin, mint, thyme etc. The herb was specifically mentioned as part of the menu in an invitation by Julius Cerialis to potential party guests. "...garnished with eggs on leaves of rue...". (Giacosa, 1992). However, it's use was not specific to a certain region or time frame, as it is also listed as an ingredient in an Omelet (Arboulastre) in the collection of French recipes of the 14th century, Le Menagier de Paris. (Greco & Rose Trans., 2009)

Rue was a common herb seen in most medieval gardens. Due to it's flavor profile it was often paired with other herbs and spices to create an overall flavor. An example is seen in Libre de sent

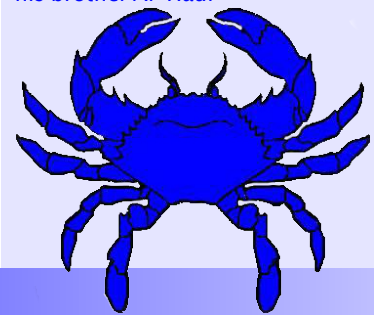

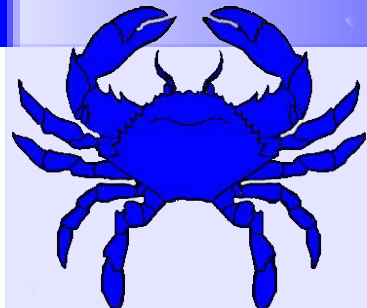

sovi in a dish called Frexols, where a combination of herbs is used including "sage, mint, hyssop, savory, rue, parsley, fennel, watercress, coriander, anise, and

"other good herbs". (Santanach, Ed., 2014)

Rue was documented as part of the seasoning of the dishes served in a banquet for 2,000 hosted by Richard II of England in 1387 for the country's Barons. (Trager, 1995)

In modern day, rue is not seen as a culinary ingredient, but more for it's use by religions such as Wicca, for love and protection magic and Santaria, for purification and cleansing. (Wisdom Products, 2021)

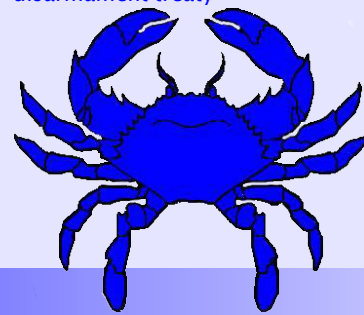

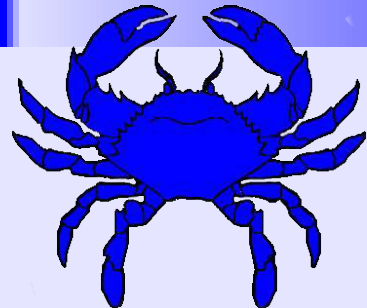
