

- Thanks to everyone who submitted their property information, it is greatly appreciated.
- ◆ I am in the very beginning of changing our bank from Wells Fargo to either First Citizens, Sandy Spring, or PNC. I am done with Wells Fargo. They have been a pain since I first took over. The most recent nonsense is they told me I was signatory on the Storvik Bank account. I've spoken to the Kingdom Exchequer who recently moved the Kingdom account away from Wells Fargo to First Citizens because she had finally had enough.
- First Citizen's Pros:
 - Several other Atlantia groups have moved to First Citizens and there is one POC for all SCA groups.
 - Electronic signatory cards.
 - Mobile check deposits
 - ♦ Free checking
- ♦ Cons:
 - Currently, there is only 1 branch in the state
 - Sandy Springs bank will give us free checking and will be easy to work with, I have not made contact with PNC Bank.
- Attended Exchequer's meeting at Unevent on and received additional information about event reservations. If you want to pay the reservationist by check it is okay to do so, but the reservationist should let the SCARS deputy know who reserved by check and she will add them to the SCARS spreadsheet so there will only be one registration list. Adding people to SCARS who pay by check, is free and we do not have to pay the 3% fee. Midwinter's Feast is our first event using SCARS so I'll see how it goes and provide additional information as I learn. There is concern the SCARS reservations are going to people's spam folder and the issue is being worked.
- The Kingdom SCARS deputy is giving a class at the next University. I encourage anyone who would like to be reservationist to take the class. SCARS is new and policy has changed. I may not always be able to attend an event and it would be great to have others who know what to do.
- Midwinters I will need help at gate. If anyone is interested in assisting, please let me know. Based on what I saw at Crown Tourney, instead of taking cash we will be checking people in, taking contact tracing information, and checking vaccination cards. I will know more based on Kingdom requirements as we get closer to the event date.
- If anyone is interested, the position of Maryland Regional Exchequer is open. Continued on page 9...







On January 16, 1572 <u>Thomas Howard,</u> <u>4th Duke of Norfolk</u> is tried for treason for his part in the <u>Ridolfi plot</u> to restore Catholicism in England.

Upon Constantine IX's deathbed, <u>Theodora</u> convened the Senate, and the imperial guard proclaimed her "Emperor" shortly before Constantine's death on January 11, 1055.



Above: This painting depicts Zhu Yuanzhang (朱元璋), Emperor Taizu of the Ming dynasty (明太祖), who reigned from 1368 to 1398. Hongwu (洪武) was the title of his reign period.

On January 23, 1368, the <u>Hongwu</u> Emperor, personal name Zhu Yuanzhang, proclaimed himself Emperor of the <u>Ming Dynasty</u> in Nanjing and adopted "Hongwu" (literally "vastly martial") as his era name.

Medieval Music – Part I Gregorian Chant is Born By Mistress Arianna Morgan, OP



Liturgical chant is the basis for the development of all western European music. Around the year 800, liturgical chant of the Roman Church started to be recorded in writing. This allowed for dissemination and preservation of the chant repertoire. Additionally, it generated new musical ideas and facilitated the learning of chant which previously was taught aurally (by ear). At this point, chant was the only written repertoire.

Scholars believe that the Chant that has survived in written form from the earlier period is already the product of a mixture of Roman and Gallican singing traditions and repertoires. This repertoire became known as Gregorian Chant thanks to the dissemination of a myth that connected Pope Gregory I aka St. Gregory (papacy between 590 – 604). This myth promulgated by Carolingians, stated that Pope Gregory was the composer of the repertoire of chant most likely to gain acceptance of new chant in the North.

Gregory was often depicted as receiving the dictation of plainchant from a dove representing the Holy Spirit. This was meant to imply that Gregorian chant was divinely inspired. The image above is from the Antiphony of Harker, Monastery of St. Gall depicts St. Gregory with a dove on his shoulder singing chant in his ear while he in turn dictates it to a scribe. Scholars believe that St. Gregory was selected as the main character of the myth because Carolingian intellectuals were English and considered St. Gregory to be the greatest Christian missionary to England.

Musicologists used to believe that the origins of Gregorian Chant were related to ancient Jewish synagogue worship. However, there is no evidence that Chant can be traced back to Old Testament practice. Therefore, it has been proposed by some scholars that chant had its beginnings in secluded vigils of the early Christians.

In the fourth century, Christian monasticism developed as a reaction to the institutionalization of the Church and its organization following a system of hierarchies. These reactionaries cloistered themselves from the world and the Church to live a solitary and simple life which they considered to be closer to the teachings of Christ. They formed communities where communal living, pious meditation, and work was the norm. In these communities the recitation of psalms became a standard practice and later a rule. Within Christianity, psalmody (the singing of psalms) had a particular context and meaning which was different to Old Testament practice. It was not meant to describe or present symbols of wealth and exuberance in relation to Continued on page 10...

Although the symbolism and practice of communal singing remained the same in later Chant, specially trained professionals formed a group known as the Schola. The members of the Schola were responsible for singing chant within the context of the mass.
